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

The Early Childhood Education Department is in the Clemmer College. Program options include a Bachelor of Science degree (Licensure & Non-Licensure), a Master's Certificate in Emergent Inquiry, a Master of Arts degree, a PhD program, and an undergraduate minor. The PreK-3 licensure programs are NCATE and NAEYC approved. The Master Teacher and Researcher concentrations of the Master of Arts degree are NAEYC accredited.
