The Gatton College of Pharmacy requires students to maintain certification in **BLS (Basic Lifesaving Support) for Healthcare Providers**. The deadline to submit a copy of your certification card is **August 1**.

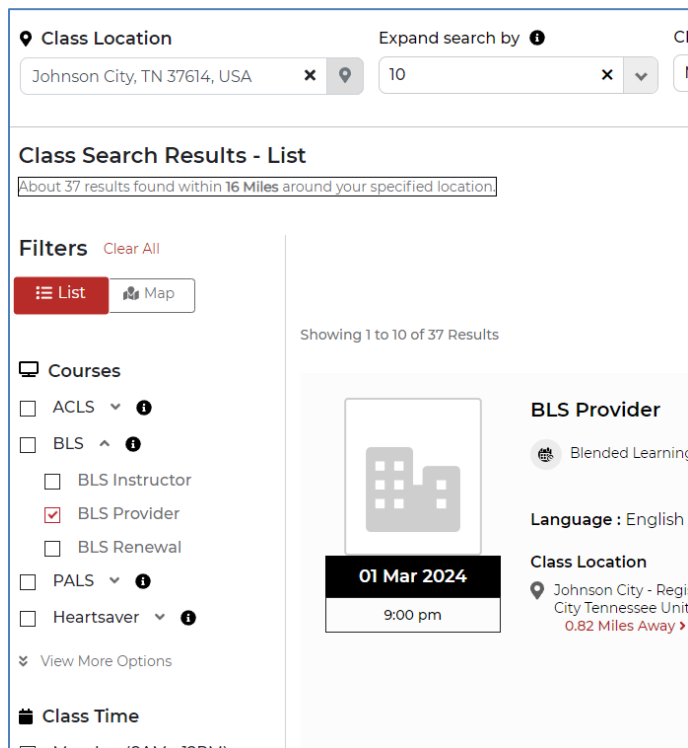
In the Johnson City, Knoxville, and Asheville areas:

- A blue BLS Provider course at <https://tricitescpr.com/training-calendar/>. Here you can also use promo code **STUDENT** to receive a \$5 discount. *Note: These courses are in the Johnson City/Tri-Cities area only.*
- <https://www.primemedicaltraining.com/class-schedule/> Select “BLS Provider” as the Course Type. “Online+Classroom” or “Classroom” are fine for Delivery Method*. When you go to enroll in a course, you may receive a discount with the code **etsustudent** (You may need to call (800) 991-6511 to have this discount applied).
**Note: If you choose the “Online+Classroom” method, you must select the Class Add-on of BLS Online Course when registering.*

If none of those options work for you, you may simply do a search on the American Heart Association website:

- Enter your city or zip code, and Find a Class.
- Enter your Date Range, making sure that the end date is prior to August 1.
- Course Name – check BLS Provider or BLS Renewal, as applicable*.
**Only select “BLS renewal” if you are already certified AND the course is prior to the end of your BLS expiration date. Otherwise, select BLS Provider.*
- Course information should appear with the closest location first.

Recently, several students have asked about a company called the “National CPR Foundation” which offers an online course called “BLS”. Unfortunately, the certification this company provides does not meet the requirement for the Gatton program or for any pharmacy professional. While this and other online companies are all too happy to take your money,

they do not offer any sort of thorough assessment of your life-saving skills. Please stick with the American Heart Association-approved courses as linked above. If you have a question about whether a certification is acceptable, please ask us before paying for it.
