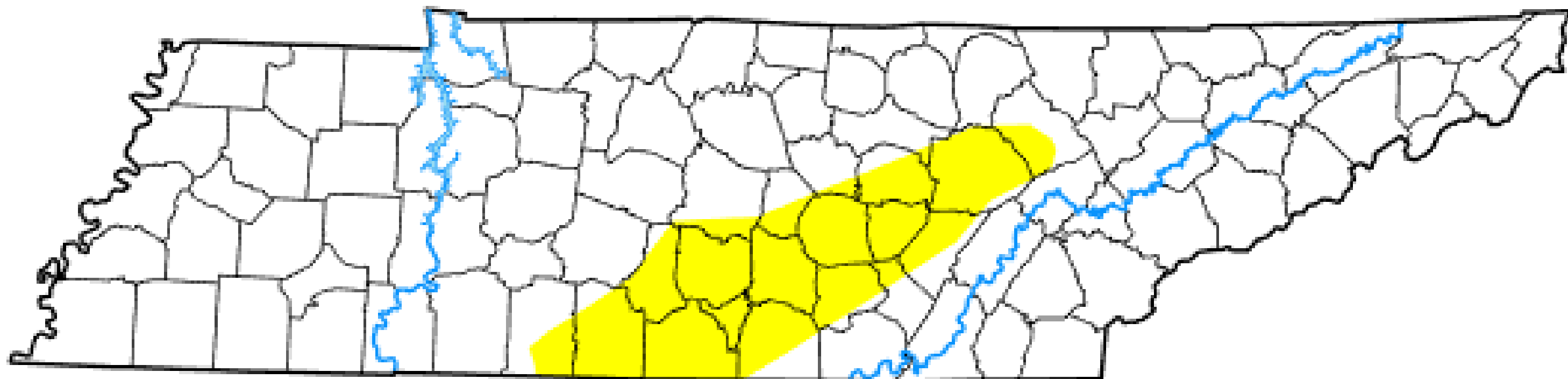


Tennessee Drought Update

For the assessment period ending May 02, 2023

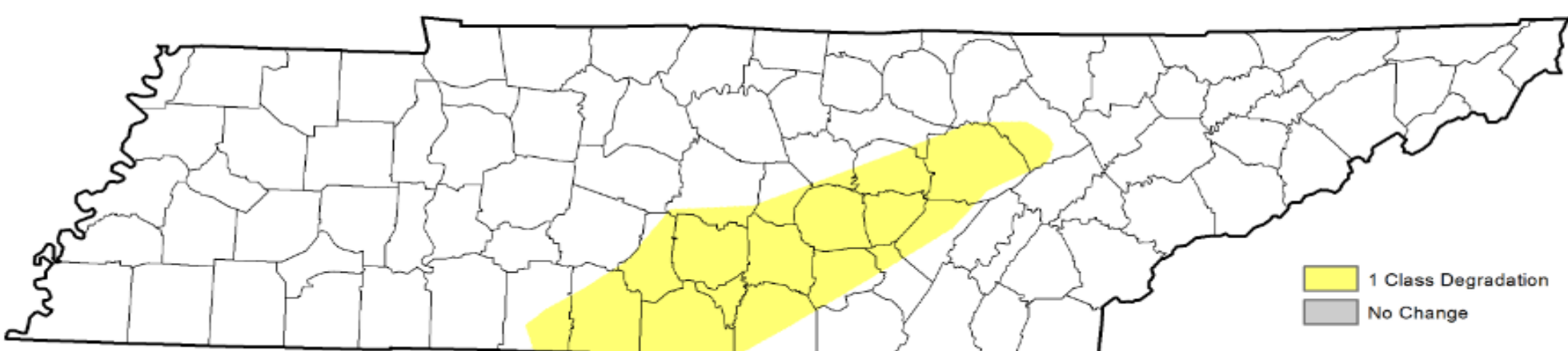
This Week's Drought Monitor of Tennessee Map

Statewide Condition Summary

What's Changed? With rain continuing in East and West Tennessee, those areas continue to stay clear of drought consideration. In Middle Tennessee and the Cumberland Plateau, conditions have worsened and caused 20 counties to enter a drought consideration of abnormally dry (DO).

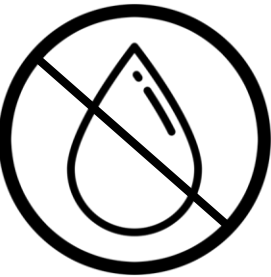
What's New? With below average rainfall amounts in Middle Tennessee and the Cumberland Plateau we see our first drought consideration since late February.

What's Next? With growing season upon us drought conditions are going to be closely monitored. Conditions may not deteriorate further in the next drought monitoring period (Tuesday to Tuesday), with most of the state expecting rain in the coming days.

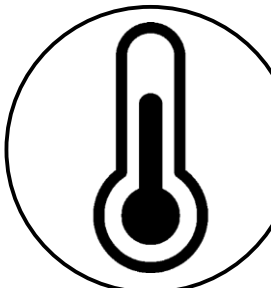

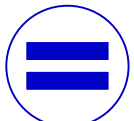
