

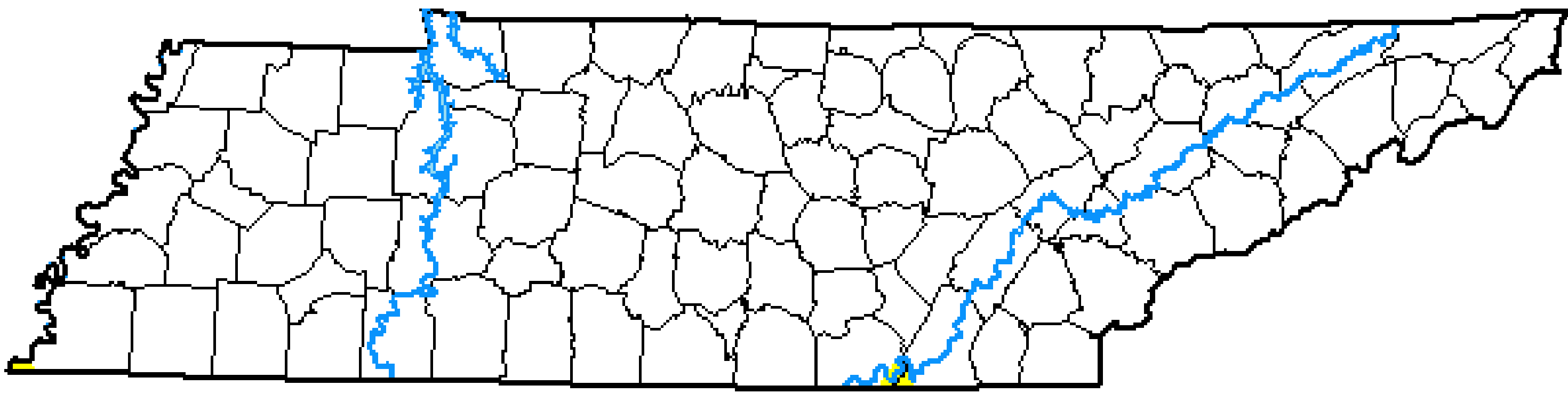
Tennessee Drought Update

Statewide Condition Summary

This Week's Drought Monitor of Tennessee Map

 Conditions have worsened slightly with minimal rainfall across much of the state.

What's Changed? With rain amounts decreasing in southern Tennessee, we see conditions worsening around the Tennessee-Alabama border.

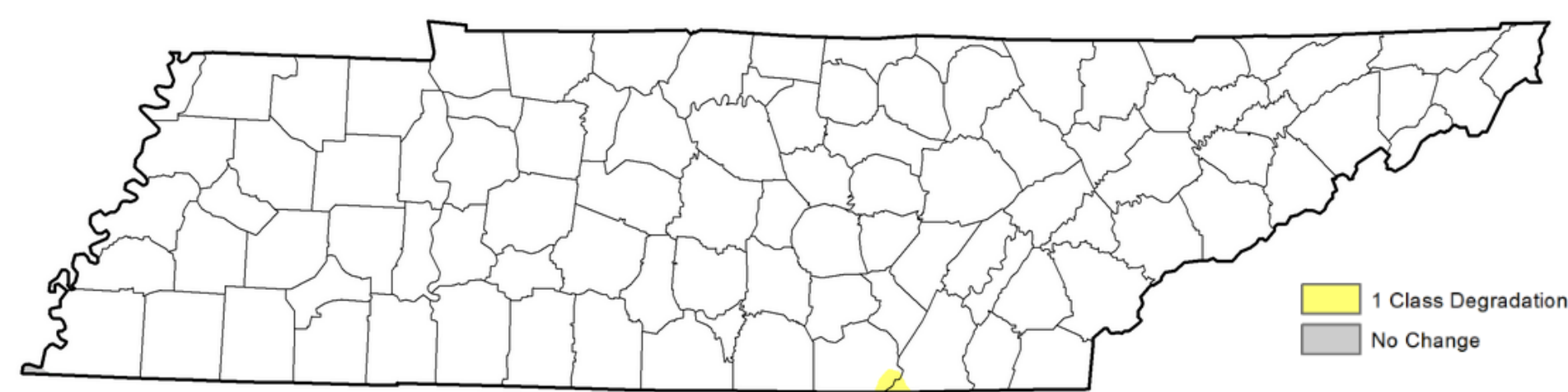
What's New? With lack of rain over the last drought monitoring period (Tuesday to Tuesday), Abnormally Dry (D0) conditions have increased across southern Tennessee.

What's Next? Temperatures are expected to be seasonal but little rainfall is in the forecast for this week's drought monitoring period (Tuesday to Tuesday). Conditions may deteriorate further across most of the state, especially southern Tennessee.

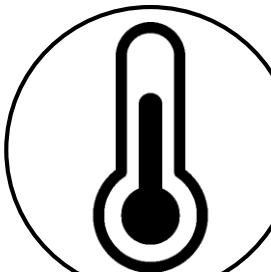
