
May 2024 Tennessee State Climate Summary

Monthly Temperature Summary:


Mean temperatures for May 2024 were warmer than normal for Tennessee, with most areas of the state recording temperatures 2-4°F above the 30-year climate normals. The month started warm with temperatures in the first week of May running 6-8°F above normal, followed by a cool down in the second week of May, when the eastern half of the state had normal to slightly cooler than normal temperatures while the western half of the state remained a bit warmer than normal. Temperatures remained a bit above normal in the third week of May and warmed even more for the 4th week of May before a cool spell in the final days of the month. During May there were three broken and five tied daily high temperature records, but there were 37 broken and 29 tied daily records for warmest overnight low temperatures. The Jackson Airport weather station tied a monthly record for the warmest low temperature recorded during May, with a low of 75°F on May 8, tying the record from May 23, 1953. Average low temperatures this month were among the top-10 warmest low temperatures for May at Memphis, Chattanooga, Oak Ridge, and the Tri-Cities. On the cool side of the record books, there was one daily record for coolest high temperature, set at Sparta on May 31, with a high of 67°F, and there were two daily record low temperatures tied this month.



Monthly Precipitation Summary:

Most areas of Tennessee also recorded above normal precipitation during May 2024, with northern portions of Middle Tennessee and the Cumberland Plateau seeing the highest rainfall totals. Some areas of Montgomery County recorded just over 300% of their normal May rainfall totals! There were a few areas with slightly below normal precipitation for the month, mostly in southwest Middle Tennessee and southeast West Tennessee as well as along the Mississippi River in West Tennessee. Unfortunately, much of the rain came with severe weather and flooding. During the first week of May heavy storms produced up 2-4" of rain in parts of Middle and East Tennessee, even up to 6" in parts of the Cumberland Plateau. Severe storms and flash flooding occurred on May 8 to start the second week of the month, with northern areas of Middle Tennessee recording over 400% normal rainfall for the week. Some areas in the southwest portions of the state were drier than normal this week though. The third week of May brought scattered storms with only a few areas recording above normal precipitation for the week. The final week of May brought heavy rains for the northern portions of the state as well as East Tennessee, with 2-5" of rain common, and some areas recording up to 8" of rain this week. A total of 36 weather stations or rain gauges across the state reported a foot of rain this month!

This May was the 4th wettest in Knoxville's 154-year weather history and the 8th wettest for Oak Ridge's 77-year weather history. Across the state, there were 58 records set for highest daily precipitation totals, including 17 records set at stations with at least a 100-year weather history. Five stations set monthly records for the highest 1-day precipitation total for the month of May. The Lebanon 7N station set an all-time record for the wettest day in the station's 68-year history, with 7.07" of rain reported on May 9, 2024 breaking the previous record of 4.38" recorded in September 1970.


The Month in Comparison:

Comparing the total precipitation and mean temperature of this May to the conditions of May over the past thirty years at select airport weather stations across the state, May 2024 was wetter and warmer than average at each of these cities. This May was the wettest for Knoxville in the past thirty years, and 4th wettest for the city's full 154-year weather history, and this May was 2nd wettest of the past thirty years for the Jackson airport, behind only 2010, and the 6th wettest May in the station's 75-year history.












Drought Monitor:

May started with 2.01% of Tennessee's area in Moderate Drought (D1) and 26.24% of the state's area in Abnormally Dry (D0) conditions. With several weeks of above normal rainfall during May, there were major improvements in the US Drought Monitor over the month. By the last release of the US Drought Monitor for May, all areas of Moderate Drought and almost all areas of Abnormally Dry conditions were removed from Tennessee. A small area of Abnormally Dry conditions remained in northwest Tennessee, right along the Mississippi River, totaling 0.29% of the state's area.





Soil Moisture:

The NASA SPORT Land Information System showed all areas of Tennessee with normal to above normal soil moisture by the end of May 2024, with most areas of the state seeing an increase in soil moisture levels over the month. However, some areas of East Tennessee and southern Middle Tennessee did see a slight drop in soil moisture levels over the month. The USDA Crop Weather report for the week ending May 26th rated topsoil moisture as 1% short, 52% adequate, and 47% percent surplus, and subsoil moisture was rated as 1% short, 62% adequate, and 37% surplus.


SPoRT-LIS 0-200 cm Soil Moisture percentile valid 31 May 2024




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Streamflow:

Tracking with the month's heavy rain and increasing soil moisture, streamflow was also up across Tennessee this month. Averaged streamflow was above normal or much above normal in most areas of East Tennessee, the Cumberland Plateau, and the eastern/northern portions of Middle Tennessee. Some streams in West Tennessee, southwestern Middle Tennessee, and northern East Tennessee did have streamflow in the average range for this month.

Miscellaneous:

Crop Conditions from USDA: Heavy rains, strong winds, and hail throughout the month produced trouble for farmers in Tennessee with some damage to crops, barns, greenhouses, and fences. The rainy pattern was good for hay and pastures, but kept many from getting the first cutting of hay completed. It has also delayed planting of some row crops, with the percent of cotton, soybeans, and corn planted falling behind the 5-year average for the end of May. However, what was planted is doing well, with more than half of all crops reported in Good or Excellent conditions.





Fire Danger: The Interagency Fire Center's outlook for significant wildfire potential shows normal potential for fires in Tennessee and all surrounding regions for May.

Story of the Month:

There were several major weather and climate events in Tennessee this month including multiple rounds of severe storms, notably May 8 and May 26. The storms on May 8 produced 2 fatalities, with one person killed by a tornado in Maury County, and one by severe thunderstorm winds in Claiborne County, there were an additional 14 weather-related injuries on May 8. The tornado that impacted Maury County was rated an EF3, the first in Tennessee this year, and prompted the National Weather Service in Nashville to issue a rare Tornado Emergency, which is reserved for storms known to be producing a large and destructive tornado. There were seven other tornadoes confirmed in Tennessee with this storm system, with 4 tornadoes in Lincoln County. This round of storms also produced 100 reports of severe thunderstorm wind damage across the state, and 47 reports of severe hail 1-inch in diameter or larger, with some hail reported up to three inches in diameter (larger than a baseball)! In addition to the severe weather up to 8-inches of rain fell in a matter of hours for northern middle Tennessee counties, prompting a flash flood emergency warning in parts of Robertson and Sumner counties. Almost 80,000 customers were without power at some point and several swift water rescues occurred.

Another large round of severe weather impacted the state on May 26 with one tornado, 52 reports of severe thunderstorm wind damage, and 18 reports of severe hail.






Radar image of Maury County tornado.




May 8 EF3 tornado seen from a webcam at Columbia Fire Station 3.

Other notable stories this month with weather/climate connections included the periodic cicada emergence and the northern lights being visible in the southern US. As soil temperatures warmed this month, Brood XIX 13-year Cicadas emerged in parts of the state, mostly in Middle Tennessee but also in parts of West and East Tennessee.

The strongest geomagnetic storm in the past 20 years hit earth early in May and triggered a strong display of the Aurora Borealis (northern lights) that was visible across Tennessee and many other areas of the US on May 11. The images below were shared by the NWS Forecast offices in Memphis and Morristown Tennessee.





Storm Reports:

*Storm Reports are based on filtered NOAA Storm Prediction Center data or local NWS storm reports. Future quality control checks may change the official record of severe events, please see spc.noaa.gov for any updates.

During the month of May 2024 there were 9 days with severe storm reports, totaling 17 tornado reports, 175 reports of severe winds/severe wind damage, and 67 reports of severe hail (1" or larger). There were 2 Fatalities and 14 weather-related injuries in Tennessee this month, all reported with the May 8 severe weather.






