SOAA Major Field Tests:

Sociology majors are required to take a Major Field Test (*Sociology Senior Exit Exam*) prior to graduation. The exam is coordinated and administered by Sociology faculty usually during a student's final semester.

Anthropology majors are required to take a Major Field Test (*Anthropology Exit Exam*) prior to graduation. Anthropology majors complete the exam in ANTH 4830 Anthropological Theory.
