

Clinical & Rehabilitative Health Sciences

- ETSU's online Bachelor of Science degree in radiologic science ranks third in the country, according to EduMed.org's rankings of the "Best Online Radiology Tech Programs for 2023."
- Dr. Lynn Williams is currently serving as Interim Dean of the College of Clinical and Rehabilitative Health Sciences.

Nursing

- On March 21, the college will hold its inaugural Pattie Lathan Browder Visiting Lecture Series event, "Nurses Live Their Stories as Caring, Competent Professionals", presented by Dr. Patricia Burkhart, Ph.D., RN. Refreshments will be served at 10:30 a.m. at the Millennium Center, followed by the lecture at the Martin Center for the Arts at 11:30 a.m.
- A \$1.3 million grant from the Tennessee Department of Health awarded to ETSU's College of Nursing and Bill Gatton College of Pharmacy will fund mobile clinics for delivering COVID-19 vaccines to rural communities.
- ETSU is among the top online nursing programs in Tennessee for 2023, according to a new ranking released by EduMed.org.

Gatton College of Pharmacy

- The college earned the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy's Lawrence C. Weaver Transformative Community Service Award this year, the top national pharmacy award for service to the community.
- The college'salumni report a 95% satisfaction rate with their PharmD education, as opposed to the national average of 82% for all pharmacy schools.

Public Health

- The Fall 2022 semester witnessed the largest total enrollment in the college's history.
- The college was listed among the top third of all public health schools and programs in the nation by U.S News & World Report.
- Of the nearly 400 recent graduates from the Department of Health Sciences, almost one-fifth have been accepted to medical school, one-fifth to graduate school, and one-fifth to either pharmacy or physician assistant school.
