




Major Gifts

- ETSU celebrated the legacy of the Brinkley family with the dedication of the James and Nellie Brinkley Center.
- The national search for two Directors of Development for Intercollegiate Athletics has concluded with the hiring of Eryn Samuels and Desmond Pierce, both former ETSU student-athletes.
- The College of Business and Technology and University Advancement are pleased to announce the appointment of Rebecca White, who will serve as Director of Development.
- The search continues for development positions for the Martin Center for the Arts and Quillen College of Medicine.

Annual Giving

Day of Giving 2023 broke previous records by securing **1,060** gifts totaling **\$358K** in 24 hours!

- Exceeded the goal for donations by 6% and increased the amount by 12%.
- We continue to ask students for support, receiving nearly 100 donations from those graduating.
- Helped students stay in school, stay engaged, and benefit from enhanced learning opportunities.

Advancement Services

Activities related to the database

- conversion to the new CRM Advance software have begun. This includes a kick-off meeting and training on constituent and prospect engagements. A data cleanup is continuing in anticipation of the first data load.
- The new Gift Processor (replacement position) is undergoing training.
- Two staff members recently attended a professional development software conference.

Planned Giving

- Rebecca Muncy attended the Charitable Estate Planning Institute and received a Fellow in Charitable Estate Planning (FCEP) certification.
- Visits with alumni and friends took place in Winston-Salem, Charlotte, Tampa/St. Petersburg, Miami, Greenville, Austin/Houston, and Moneta (Virginia).

Alumni Association

- A successful "An Evening with ETSU: Atlanta" event was held.
- Two events "Biscuits with the Bucs" and a Williamson County alumni reception – took place in the Nashville area.
- Communications were sent regarding the alumni survey and the close of alumni etsu.edu email accounts.



UNIT REPORTS

Student Life and Enrollment

- The ETSU freshman class has grown by 25% over the last two years.
- The first-time freshman six-year graduation rate has increased by 15% over the last six years.
- Bucky's Food Pantry has distributed over 11,000 pounds of food this year to students in need, representing a 20% increase.
- Peer Mentoring is up 70% over the last five years with over 900 students served in Fall 2022.
- ETSU VOTES was recognized by the Tennessee Secretary of State for 2022 voter registration efforts and for being the state's first on-campus voting site.

WETS-FM (89.5)

- The WETS Tower Replacement Project had a Pre-Bid Meeting, followed by a Transmitter Site visit, on April 25. This opened the project for bids, with a May 10 deadline.
- In terms of fundraising, WETS was approximately \$8,000 higher than the previous year's total at the same point in time.

Athletics

- The ETSU women's basketball program, led by first-year head coach Brenda Mock Brown, had a historic year in 2022-23, ending with a program-record 25 wins and finishing third in the Women's Basketball Invitational.
- On March 11, ETSU women's tennis head coach Ricky Rojas won his 100th career match.
- Brooks Savage is the new Buccaneers' men's basketball head coach.

Martin Center for the Arts

- The Center made history by bringing Broadway to the region, presenting four Broadway touring productions to sold-out audiences.
- For fiscal year 2022-23, the Center has sold over 22,000 tickets; this does not include events hosted by Theatre and Dance and Music.
