They also offer social and emotional support and enriching activities that spark kids' interest in school and learning.

Research shows that students participating in high-quality afterschool programs are less likely to abuse drugs or alcohol; are more likely to advance to the next grade and graduate from high school; earn higher grades and do better on standardized tests. Some out-of-school-time programs even provide opportunities for youth to gain employability skills, connect with local businesses, and explore possible careers.
