***NOTE: 50 University Hour Requirement:** The University requires that all graduates complete 50 hours from a senior-level (4-year) college or institution. The RN/BSN major comprises 32 semester credits; therefore, an additional 18 semester credits must be completed at a senior-level college or university (ETSU or another 4-year institution).

***NOTE:** Graduates of schools holding articulation agreements with ETSU are eligible for an additional 8 hours of credit through assessment for successful completion of the program. Diploma graduates are also eligible for 39 hours of credit through assessment. Please contact your advisor for a list of institutions holding current Transfer Articulation Agreements and credit through assessment for diploma students.

***NOTE:** 12+ Credit hours is full-time at the university level at ETSU.
