ACADEMIC PHARMACY FELLOWSHIP EMPHASES IN SOCIAL/BEHAVIORAL RESEARCH AND PUBLIC HEALTH

Overview:

The East Tennessee State University (ETSU) Gatton College of Pharmacy is pleased to offer a 2-year postgraduate fellowship training program with emphases in academia, applied social/behavioral research, and public health. The overarching goal of the program is to equip fellows for rigorous careers that advance pharmacy education and practice as informed through a public health perspective.

Program Description:

The fellow will develop their skills through multiple avenues at ETSU, including: development of teaching skills through active participation in the Doctor of Pharmacy curriculum; contribution to research projects that advance pharmacy education and/or practice; completion of a Master of Public Health (MPH) degree; engagement in interprofessional initiatives; advancement of practice skills through tailored experiences in community-based (outpatient) settings; and service to the college, profession, and community. The fellow will have the opportunity to complete a Teaching and Learning Certificate through the UNC CIPHER program. The fellowship structure is highly individualized based on previous training and/or practice experience and career goals. Annual salary ranges from \$51,500 to \$54,500 on a sliding scale commensurate with previous experience.

Programmatic Aims:

- Provide a supportive, high-quality training environment for fellows to develop the knowledge, confidence, and skills to perform teaching and research tasks independently by completion of the program
- Cultivate the fellow's ability to critically evaluate teaching and research methods and effectively communicate scientific thought in written and verbal forms
- Advance scientific knowledge with emphases on the intersections of community-based pharmacy practice, public health, and academia
- Develop fellows both personally and professionally

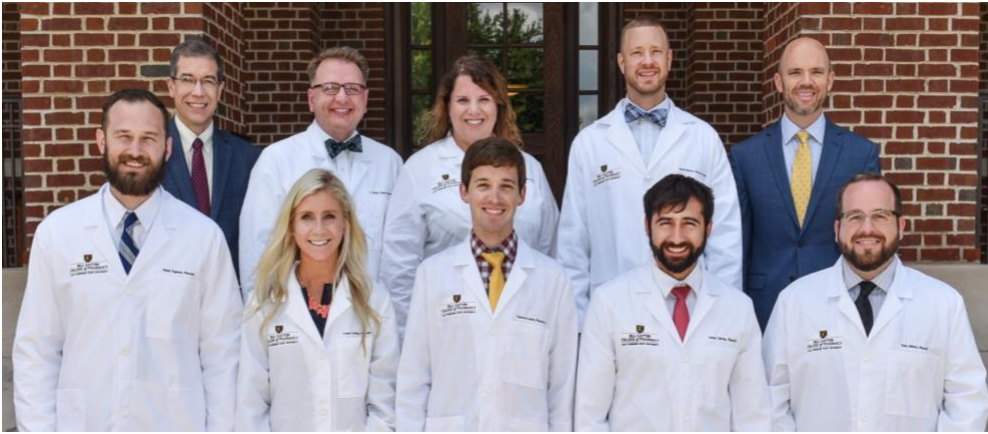

Training Environment:

Gatton College of Pharmacy is part of ETSU Health along with the Colleges of Medicine, Nursing, Public Health, and Health Sciences. ETSU enrolls approximately 14,000 students in a vibrant, family-friendly community in beautiful Northeast Tennessee. The academic pharmacy fellow and PGY2 residents work in the Department of Pharmacy Practice housed within the historic College of Pharmacy building and next door to the state-of-the-art Interprofessional Education and Research Center on ETSU's Veterans Affairs campus in Johnson City. The fellow is mentored by the program director and successful educators, researchers, and clinicians across multiple colleges, including Pharmacy, Public Health, and Medicine.

Qualifications:

Applicants must have completed a PharmD or other terminal pharmacy degree on or before June 30, 2025 and be eligible for pharmacist licensure in the State of Tennessee. Completion of a PGY-1 residency or equivalent pharmacy practice experience is preferred but not required. Applicants should have a strong desire for teaching, research, and practice in an academic environment.
