Please note that this only applies to ETSU-owned equipment. Any personal devices are excluded from these steps.

On April 28, ETSU will be implementing Two-Factor Authentication (2FA) for GoldLink and Administrative Systems for faculty and staff. Users will need to use their ETSU username and password, and then complete the Two-Factor Authentication steps using the personal phone number or email address on file within the Banner Employee Dashboard/Self Service section under "Employee" in order to access the following systems: GoldLink, Banner Self Service, Banner 8 INB, Banner 9 Admin Pages, eBucs, Curriculumlog, Degree Works, ePrint, Dynamic Forms, Handshake, Innosoft Fusion, Preferred Name Request, TargetX,

DesignConductor, BDM and BDMSecurity, and TRS.

All faculty and staff are encouraged to review the information on file and make sure it is accurate before April 28.
