Committee Members Appointed for National Search to Select Senior Vice President for Academics and Provost

Several weeks ago, Dr. Wilsie Bishop, Senior Vice President for Academics and Interim Provost, informed me of her plans to retire from ETSU at the end of June 2021 following more than 40 years of distinguished service at this institution. Dr. Bishop's legacy is profound. Counted among the many highlights of her tenure are transformative advances in health sciences education and a distinguished career with SACSCOC.

As I shared with University Council last week, Dr. Keith Johnson, Vice President for Equity and Inclusion, will lead the search committee for Dr. Bishop's successor, and earlier this week members of the search committee were named. I would like to thank these individuals for their willingness to serve in this capacity, and I extend best wishes as they begin their work during the week we return from Thanksgiving break. Tentative plans are to have a final candidate identified by April 2021.
