VI. Vice President’s Report – David Finney

1. University Council Update
 - a. Approved policy/fees and purchasing policy
 - b. No faculty senate update
 - c. Football @7:30—home game
 - d. Volleyball beat Clemson
 - e. Yong gravy Concert
 - f. SACS was submitted last week
 - g. Heather Levesque—enrollment for fall term is 2,056 for freshmen; 1st timers up 200, dual enrollment up 219, transfers down (community college enrollment is also down), out of state up 70%



- h. Chapel—enrollment is up 200+ students and we budgeted to be down 200; decrease in ethnic groups, increase in male enrollment
 - 1. ENROLLMENT CONCERNS: Liz—is concerned that late admissions after classes start will set students up to fail, which could negatively impact retention; Veronica—financial is also impacted by late arrivals as students are purged, which causes more work for staff; David E.—purge is on a Sunday, can it be moved? The second purge is the trouble spot
 - 2. Joy—2021 retention at 67%, goal is 85% by 2026; Graduate rate 51% for spring 2022, goal of 60% by 2026
- i. Dr. Hoff-reevaluating Peer Institutions report (currently 15 on the list with similar programs w/ medical schools); KPIs—enrollment, student success, physical sustainability, increased reporting, stewardship of place
- j. Dr. Noland was absent—no report
- k. Equity and Inclusion conference at the end of the month

- 2. BJ King is retiring and a search will be underway soon. Provost will chair and will include senior leaders on the committee

VII. President's Report – Joy Fulkerson

- 1. Meeting with Dr. Noland went well —3% raise (might be 4%), 1% strategic raise for some areas; the Board of Trustees will vote on this during the meeting and we will see the raise in November.
- 2. Huron Report—getting closer to being finished; should get a report by Oct. 14th during the University Address; building budgets looking forward instead of looking at what is solid
- 3. We will continue to push for the family leave policy—this does have budget implications
- 4. Some staff reached out regarding staff mental health; the university does not have strong mental health support for staff
- 5. Staff Senate updates: Elections—we did not get much interest, staff leaders will put out another call for January appointments (3, 6, & 7 were open); committee work—by laws need to be updated, prioritize committee work in priority areas
- 6. Don—HR does not help with retirement—they make you call the state
 - a. He will start a FAQ/Q&A and will go from there
 - b. Can HR give us the name of the state person to contact?
