

## About the Campus Sustainability Fee

The Campus Sustainability Fee – also referred to as the Green Fee – started in 2008 with a vote by students and the SGA to approve a small fee that would help fund sustainability projects across campus.

## What is the Campus Sustainability Fee?

A \$7 per semester student fee that has funding more than \$1,000,000 worth of sustainability-related projects at ETSU

#### Fee Administration

The Campus Sustainability Fee Committee, comprised of students, faculty, and staff, are charged with identifying and recommending uses of the funds. Final funding approval is determined by Facilities Management and the Vice President of Finance and Administration.

Replace existing
fluorescent lights in WarfPickel's common area
hallways with energy
efficient LED lighting.
