### **Courses in Programs of Study**

### Federal financial aid CPOS rule

When determining enrollment status, DOE counts only credits taken in a student's program of study.

"Program of study" means degree program or undeclared.

Previously passed courses may be retaken one time only and still count towards enrollment status.

Undergrads enrolled in  $\geq$  12 CPOS credits/grads in  $\geq$  5 eligible for full aid.

## Important dates

Fall 2019	CPOS rules applied to enrolled students
July 15	Process to review students' courses starts running
April 27	First orientation occurs (BIO)
April 4	Fall term registration begins
(March 1)	Advisement for fall registration begins

### Issues

Courses taken by students in pre-programs for competitive-admissions majors are not FFA-eligible.

Enrolling in < 12 undergrad or 5 grad CPOS credits in fall or spring term reduces FFA.

Courses taken for a major or minor a student has not yet declared are generally not FFA-eligible.

Courses taken by students with 60 or more credits who are enrolled in undeclared/academic focus areas are not FFA-eligible.

#### Issues

Graduate credits in reading/research that exceed the number specified in the student's degree program are not FFA-eligible.

Students may avoid taking courses not required in programs of study.

Some required or strongly recommended courses will not count in students' programs of study.

## Selected plan elements

- 1. Revise undergraduate admissions application
- 2. Advise current students to move to degree programs
- 3. Train advisors to assure all students' majors (and minors) are up to date
- 4. Scan for undergrads enrolled in < 12 CPOS credits and grads in < 5; work with students to correct schedules
- 5. Resolve unknowns, e.g., CSCI 1100, grad. readings & research
- 6. Craft careful messaging to students
